

Find Fish Folks from 4 States

You are invited to attend the 2010 Multistate Aquaculture Forum on Saturday, Jan. 16, in Huntington, WV. For the first time, West Virginia's annual Aquaculture Forum will be held jointly with organizations from four states: West Virginia, Ohio, Kentucky, and Michigan.

Producer associations, regulators, and educators are working together on a high-impact program. The forum will be held in the Don Morris Room of the Memorial Student Center on the Marshall University Campus in Huntington.

The program features an industry update, research highlights, presentations by leading aquaculture businessmen, and discussions about development of the aquaculture industry.

Activities include a poster session highlighting aquaculture research results and a reception featuring regional aquaculture products.

Participants will meet and speak with fish folks from the region, and the associations from Ohio, West Virginia, and Michigan will hold business meetings.

Participants will receive information on a wide variety of topics and learn about where to get fish, feed, supplies, and information about growing aquaculture products.

Take Pre-forum Tour Friday, Jan. 15

Register for Friday's free tour to the Ohio Center for Aquaculture Research and Development in Piketon, Ohio. The center strives to increase the productivity, innovation, and profitability of Ohio and U.S. aquaculture operations, while respecting sustainability and good stewardship. It is home to the Ohio Genetic Improvement of Farmed-fish Traits Program. The tour departs the Pullman Plaza Hotel at noon and returns at 5 p.m.

Enjoy Rare Opportunity

This is an uncommon opportunity for growers, researchers, and regulators from these states to exchange ideas. Though growers in these states have much in common, programs in each state are in different regions. Kentucky is in the Southern region. Ohio and Michigan are in the North-central region. West Virginia is in the Northeastern region.

The registration fee is \$10 for Saturday's meeting (to help cover the cost of the meal). Friday's field trip is free, but registration is required and must be received by Jan. 8.

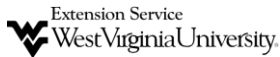

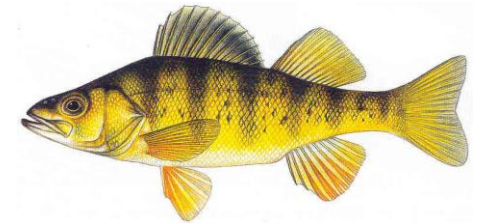
